

SERVICES AVAILABLE UNDER HPRP

HPRP services are provided to qualified households to prevent homelessness and to quickly re-house households that are already homeless. HPRP assistance is short term, targeted, and designed to provide the appropriate level of services so that a household can become stably housed. Due to the extremely high demand in Riverside County services will be used efficiently so that the highest number of eligible households can be serviced. Applicants should plan on short term assistance (not to exceed 90 days) and a minimum of 90 days case management. The charts below document eligibility criteria, services provided, and financial assistance limits.

Homeless Prevention – financial assistance and housing case management for households that are currently housed and who are facing the immediate loss of their housing.

Rapid Re-housing Services – available to household who meet HPRP definition of homeless and households who have the ability to maintain permanent housing once HPRP services are discontinued

The amount of HPRP assistance and the duration of assistance will be determined by the HPRP Housing Specialist and is based on each household's unique circumstances.
